MOZAMBICAN President Samora Machel's plane 2 was being of "the deliberate influence of a powerful ground transmitter deployed outside Maputo airport", according to an independent Soviet analysis of the evidence collected by a tripartite commission.

The commission comprising Mozambique, South Africa and the Soviet Union, found traces of an abandoned army camp at the site where the Soviet TU-134 plane carrying President Machel from Lusaka to Maputo airport went off-course and crashed on October

19.

Mr Ivan Vasin, Soviet Deputy Aviation Minister cited this conclusion in "Izvestia" newspaper on Saturday and asserted that the totality circumstances left doubt that the crash was an act of subversion.

Although representatives from Mozambique, Africa South and Soviet Union jointly discussed and agreed the evidence, South Africa withdrew from the

The Soviets then carried out an analysis of the evidence independently.

In his interview Izvestia Cde Vasin said the evidence showed that plane's engines, systems. units. instruments onboard piloting, navigational and equipment were in perfect order.
