

Mozambique: MNR peace proposals (ME/0534 ii) In a 16-point plan presented on 15th August to the delegation of Mozambican bishops who went to Nairobi to negotiate on the government's behalf, the MNR called for the withdrawal of foreign troops from Mozambique but did not mention its earlier call for multi-party elections, Radio Renascenca (Lisbon) reported on the 15th. It quoted MNR leader Afonso Dhlakama as saying that in recent shelling, Zimbabwean and Malawian troops had killed 500 people: the presence of those troops was an obstacle to the peace process. In the plan, the MNR "calls for genuine negotiations conducive to a national reconciliation".
