Mozambique: exile groups on talks between government and MNR (Except) Efforts for peace in Mozambique not only involve talks between Frelimo and Renamo, but other currents of opinion [words indistinct] also have something to say. (?Dias Belo) from the Committee for Mozambican Unity. [Comite Para A Uniao Mocambicana] and [words indistinct] have been meeting in Lisbon and made their conclusions known today.

[Unidentified speaker] (?Unamo) feels that a government of national reconciliation resulting from an understanding or a coalition between the two military forces Renamo and Frelimo will once more lead to the formation of a single party and consequent dictatorial regime if free multiparty general legislative elections do not follow.

[Announcer] The two Mozambican movements in exile also decided to request the intervention of the UN Security Council to impose the immediate withdrawal of foreign forces from their country.

[Unidentified speaker] Only thus will peace be possible, effective and durable, making national reconstruction viable. (?Comonu) and (?Unamo) recognise Renamo's powerful action which succeeded in bringing Frelimo to the negotiation table for immediate peace. So that peace may be effective and durable all Mozambican political forces must participate in the negotiations. All political forces must participate in the definition of political, economic and social principles of the future Mozambican political constitution. . .
