

Mozambican churchmen hold second round of talks with MNR in Nairobi (ME/0548 ii) In a dispatch from Luanda on 31st August the Yugoslav agency said a church delegation from Mozambique had started a second round of talks with MNR representatives in Nairobi. A commentary broadcast on Radio Mozambique (Maputo)* on 30th August accused certain opposition groups abroad of "pure political and economic opportunism", saying they had links with Portuguese settlers and rejected the Mozambican government's amnesty and a possible government of national reconciliation. The radio named two of the groups as Monamo (Mozambique Nationalist Movement) and Cunimo (Committee for Mozambican Unity), and described them as "totally unknown". These two groups, the commentary said, had held a meeting in Lisbon on 26th-27th August "to achieve what they described as the unification of all Mozambican political organisations in exile, excluding the armed bandits".
