1960	Assistance towards his education as a painter from an architect

1965	Arrested by the Portugese secret police PIDE; 13 months confinement
1971	Scholarship in Lisbon; contact to non-African art

1973/74	Travel to Europe; further contact to museums and galleries
1975	After Mozambique's independence, Malangatana intensifies his cultural and entertaining activities with the support of the new government
1980	Director of the Department for Arts and Crafts
After 1981	Independent and group exhibitions with other artists from Mozambique in Africa, Asia, Europe and North America
1984	Invitation by Indira Gandhi to give an exhibition in India together with the mozambican sculptor Chissano
1985	He resigns from his office to devote more time to his artistic activities
1986	Member of the mozambican Parliament
1987	Stays in Sweden, Norway, Austria; Projects with school-aged children
1988	Stage painting for Nelson Mandela's Birthday Celebration in Wembley Stadium, London; Television broadcast with more than 700 million viewers
