

Military training for Mozambique's port and railway workers (Text) A military training course for port and railway workers employed in the south of Mozambique has ended with a passing-out parade in Maputo. The workers have been learning military skills to help in the defence of the ports and railways against possible attacks by South Africa or South Africa-backed bandits. The course, which lasted two months, was the second of its kind for port and railway workers this year. Workers and peasants throughout Mozambique are being armed and organized by the Frelimo Party to form what is described in a Frelimo policy document as a wall of steel against enemy aggression.
