• Two British nationals were killed by Mozambique National Resistance (MNR) rebels near the border with South Africa on 13 January. The brothers, Peter and Christopher Hunt, who live in South Africa, had driven across the border into Mozambique when they were attacked. A MNR spokesman repeated that all foreigners were regarded as military targets: 10 foreign aid workers were killed in MNR ambushes in December (AED 21:12:84). The government says it is taking extra measures to protect foreign aid workers but has not given details. Meanwhile, a senior official of the ruling Frelimo party has been arrested for passing military information to the MNR. Roberto Frequera, who was party political secretary for Gorongosa district in central Mozambique, admits the charge, but says it was only because of rebel intimidation. He says the rebels cut off his brother's hand and later kidnapped his parents.
