Mozambique's Chissano on instability in southern Africa (Text) The Minister of Foreign Affairs, Joaquim Chissano, has stressed that the international community must contribute to the strengthening of the defence capability of Mozambique and Angola in the form of investments and loans which may lead to quick progress in economic, social and cultural development. Joaquim Chissano, who was speaking in London yesterday at a conference on southern Africa, said that this is the first of a series of four essential points so as to secure a solution to the instability in southern Africa.

As a second point, he said that the armed bandits must be fought in any centre where they prepare themselves outside Mozambique, adding that any hesitation in this struggle, constitutes an encouragement to armed banditry. Third, Joaquim Chissano said that it was necessary to redouble efforts to put an end to apartheid and said that a solution in South Africa entailed support for the ANC and the United Democratic Front and the application of UN resolution 435 on Namibia. Fourth, he said that it was necessary that the international community should compel South Africa to take a much more serious attitude to its relations with the southern African countries.
