Chissano Warns RSA on Fulfilling Nkomati Accord

[Text] Mozambique's foreign minister, Joaquim Chissano, has warned that whoever does not fulfill the Nkomati nonaggression accord signed with South Africa last year will have to face the consequences of not fulfilling the agreement. He was speaking on arrival last Friday in the capital of Sao Tome, one of the five African countries that defeated Portuguese colonialism. He is in

Sao Tome for a ministerial meeting of the five. Mr Chissano said whoever does not fulfill the Nkomati Accord is on the side of injustice, adding that Mozambique should use the agreement to spread truth and justice in the world, in South Africa, and in Mozambique. Mr Chissano said the accord is a valid instrument. Mozambique signed the accord because it needed peace and the people's social and economic development.

Under the accord, Pretoria pledged to halt its support for the MNR terrorists, but since March 1984 it has become clear that backing for the terrorists has been coming from within South Africa, a fact admitted by some South African Government ministers.

The ministerial meeting in Sao Tome will review the activities of the five countries and draw up new plans for implementation until the next heads of state summit to be held in Luanda, the capital of Angola.
