

MNR accuses Zimbabwe of forced military training "under British auspices" (Text of Johannesburg radio report) The anti-government insurgent group in Mozambique, Renamo [Mozambique National Resistance Movement - MNR], says Zimbabwean forces in Mozambique are forcibly recruiting Mozambicans for military training in Zimbabwe under British auspices [as heard]. In a statement issued in Lisbon, Renamo said 12 such recruits who had escaped had been shot for desertion. It said the 6,000 Zimbabwean troops who were concentrated in the central Mozambique town of Vila Paiva de Andrade were forcibly rounding up young Mozambican legions for training at Inyanga in Zimbabwe. Inyanga, it said, was a centre for training by British army officers. Renamo said the 12 Mozambican recruits had been shot in the presence of British officers [last two sentences as heard].
