AUSTRALIAN free-lance film makers Fionna Douglas and Steve Lebitt arrived in the southern Mozambican provincial town of HOMOINE on Monday, two days after the massacre in which South African-backed MNR bandits murdered at least 366 people, and managed to film some of the aftermath.

They have been in Mozambique producing a documentary for Australian television on destabilisation and famine in Mozambique.

The two Australians arrived in HOMOINE and went straight to the local hospital where the bandits killed most of the patients and staff.

"We went into the front room. There was complete turmoil. There were stethoscopes on the floor and chairs turned over," Fionna Douglas told AIM.

She said she and her colleague went to the cemetery afterwards for the funerals that were already taking place. — ZIANA-AIM-PANA.
