Mozambique: "bandit" attack on Methodist (Text) In Inhambane province last month, a group of armed bandits attacked the mission of the United Methodist Church at Cambina. Quoting Xadreque Mujonde, administrative director of that organisation, AIM revealed that e bandits visited the home of the head pastor and destroyed everything, including a car. The source also disclosed that the & criminals went into the theology school and the local hospital, W where they stole medicines, mattresses and crockery and destroyed the furniture. Xadreque Mujonde said the attack was carried out by a group of more than 500 men on 17th May. They encircled the mission and fired in all directions. In this criminal action, the bandits dynamited the turbines of the power station, the water pump and cut the telephone links with Morrumbene town. It should be noted that all the infrastructures destroyed by the armed bandits had been rehabilitated by the United Methodist Church after an accord with the Mozambican government. AIM also learned that during (?May), the armed bandits attacked two towns of Panda and Morrumbene, also in Inhambane province. (Maputo home service in Portuguese 1730 gmt 15 Jun 88)
