Mozambique: Zambezia Governor says military situation improving (Excerpt) The military situation in Zambezia Province has improved lately, two years after the armed bandit attempt to divide the country along the Zambezi valley. This was stated by Carlos Agostinho do Rosario, First Party Secretary and Governor of Zambezia Province in Quelimane on 22nd June. Governor Carlos do Rosario was speaking on the occasion of the first anniversary of the creation of the provincial military command. In his speech, Carlos do Rosario spoke of the offensive launched by Mozambique armed forces units, which resulted in Luabo, Mopeia, Chimuala, Zero, Micaune, Posto Campos, Morrumbala, Rio Mamede and Milange, and several localities in Mocuba being retaken. These places had been invaded by the armed bandits. The Zambezia Governor appealed for an emergency campaign in order to assist the recently freed population. . .
