MNR bandits kidnap SA family of four

LISBON.

MOZAMBICAN bandits said yesterday they had kidnapped a family of four South Africans after their damaged yacht landed on the beach at Vilanculos, south of Bazaruto, on May 1.

A spokesman for the MNR bandits said in Lisbon that David and Sandy Muller and their sons Seth and Tony were in good health.
"I don't know how

"I don't know how long they will be held," the spokesman said in Lisbon. The bandits have often kidnapped foreigners.

The Mullers left their East London home on March 31 in their yacht, Arwin, intending to call at Maputo and then at Bazaruto Island, some 600 km up the coast of Mozambique.

Meanwhile, MNR bandits murdered four civilians in an attack before dawn on Sunday morning against the town of Mandlakazi, in the southern Mozambican province of Gaza, Radio Mozambique reported vesterday.

The bandits also wounded 11 people, four of the seriously.
However, they did not succeed in causing any serious damage to the town.

This is the fourth time that Mandlakazi, which is about 280 km north of Maputo, has come under MNR bandit attack.

Radio Mozambique also said that during April Mozambican troops killed 32 bandits in the districts of Inharrime and Zavala in the southern province of Inhambane. — Ziana-Reuter-AIM.
