EEC to give \$1m to refugees

THE Commission of European Communities has pledged more than \$1 million for emergency programmes in Mozambique, a statement from the EEC delegation in Zimbabwe has said.

The programmes, which will benefit two Mozambican provinces, will involve \$740 000 for the Zambezia province and

\$460 000 for Tete province and will be implemented by two British non-governmental organications. Oxfam (UK) and World Vision (UK).

The Tete programme will be executed from Zimbabwe and will provide emergency rehabilitation for displaced peasant farmers. The target is to supply 15 000 families with seeds, tools and ex-

tension services.

This is the third EEC assistance to the Tete province executed from Zimbabwe this year. The first was a consignment of 6 000 tonnes of maize and the second comprised groundnuts, beans, milk powder blankets and medicines worth \$1,86 million through the Zimbabwe Freedom From Hunger Campaign.
