

# EEC sets up two emergency programmes <sup>SMAL</sup> for Mozambique <sup>1870426</sup>

THE Commission of the European Communities has set up two emergency programmes benefiting Mozambique in the provinces of Zambezia and Tete.

Both programmes will cost the EEC more than a million dollars with Zambezia province getting \$740 000 and Tete \$460 000.

The programme in Tete will be executed from Zimbabwe and aims at providing an emergency rehabilitation programme for displaced peasant farmers. The target is to supply 15 000 families with seeds, tools and extension service support.

According to an EEC statement issued in Harare last week, this is the third assistance to the Tete province this year financed by the Commission and executed from Zimbabwe.

Meanwhile a spokesman for the Canadian High Commission has announced that Canada will contribute \$15 million in food aid to Mozambique. These funds come as a result of a Canadian government fact-finding mission to Mozambique and the world-wide appeal launched by the United Nations Disaster Relief Co-ordinator's Office (UNDRO).
